ELFMAN-WAREHAM PRIVATE EQUITY AND VENTURE CAPITAL LAB (PE/VC LAB)

An application-based, experiential learning program where Chicago Booth students gain hands-on experience in the private equity and venture capital industries through the combination of an intensive internship and a course.



OVERVIEW:

The Elfman-Wareham Private Equity and Venture Capital Lab (PE/VC Lab) is an experiential learning program that includes a Spring quarter class as well as an internship for 15-20 hours per week for at least 10 weeks at a private equity or venture capital fund. Internships may take place during the Spring quarter, Winter quarter, or both quarters.

Students are matched with a firm based on the firm's criteria and the student's background. Each firm looks for a specific background based on their investment focus and current projects. Participants work on specific assignments ranging from evaluating new market and business opportunities for investment to analyzing specific issues faced by portfolio companies.

WHO SHOULD APPLY?

The PE/VC Lab is open to current, full-time Chicago Booth students as well as evening and weekend program students with flexible schedules. XP students are not eligible to participate in the Lab. International students may participate, but must meet with the Office of International Affairs (OIA) and secure work authorization before accepting an internship offer. The PE/ VC Lab requires a significant time commitment. Selected students are urged to register for only three courses (including the Lab) during the quarter in which they are interning.
